Title IX

What is Title IX

Title IX is a federal law that protects all students, employees, vendors, visitors and volunteers of Coastal Carolina Community College from sex discrimination, sexual misconduct, and sexual harassment.

“No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.”

Coastal Carolina Community College is dedicated to creating a safe and welcoming environment that is conducive to academic excellence and personal growth.

All CCCC students, faculty, staff, administrators, counselors and visitors must comply with Title IX.

What qualifies as sex-based harassment?

Sex-based harassment refers to harassment on the basis of a sexual nature that is not welcome, is personally offensive, debilitates morale or interferes with the work performance or academic performance and effectiveness of its victims.

What happens when Title IX concerns are reported?

The Title IX Coordinator or designee will meet with the reporting party to discuss the Title IX concern (subject to confidentiality requests except in limited cases).

Coastal Carolina Community College is committed to a prompt, fair and equitable investigation.

Retaliation is Prohibited

Retaliation against any reporting party or anyone who participates in an investigation is strictly prohibited by college policy and by law.

Individuals are encouraged to report any retaliatory action taken by college employees, responding party and/or other students. If retaliation occurs, Coastal Carolina Community College will take appropriate action.

NOTE: Conduct prohibited by Title IX may also implicate other state or federal laws. Making a complaint to the Title IX Coordinator does not replace the complainant's right to pursue other options or remedies under the law, nor does it satisfy any timeliness requirements for asserting a claim under state or federal law.
